VISION

To teach that the purposes and designs of God are eternal, that is, that they cover from generation to generation. When Christ manifests himself in the life of a child or young person, the promises of God given for generations, reaching the child or young person and extending to future generations, are fulfilled.

MISSION

OBJECTIVES

Impart the importance of placing our gaze on the eternal and not on the temporal. Minister faith, hope and vision for the plans that God has in the lives of children and young people to advance in the process of being transformed to be able to transform.



TRAJECTORY

It is important to remember the sequence we have had in the themes of the previous camps, since these have served as a platform to continue building the lives of the children and youth of our communities.

The importance of the armor of God for our lives has been developed in the beginning, taking into account the amount of risks that there are in this island it was necessary to equip with this armor.



Then we could establish identity in the lives, making known that what we are is not based on what we have or do but what we are, and we are children of God.



Once equipped and connected with our identity, we move towards our positioning and functionality in the Kingdom of God. It was of great importance to recognize the importance of the functioning of the Kingdom of God as part of a culture superior to the earthly so that we can thus acquire our position in what Christ Jesus came to bring, The Kingdom.



At this time we are convinced that each run up camp produces activation in children and youth leads to a better approach to the Lord. One of the most important difficulties is the way of thinking. A short-term mentality, from day to day causes hope and faith to stagnate, and the custom of living cycles year after year have kept dormant generations from being transformed. Is time to set eyes on eternity. It's time to move on to the transformation



INVESTMENT OF TIME

Each week we will have three days of activities. (Wednesday, Thursday and Friday). It is important to mention that the themes will be taught by local missionaries. The established time of development will be as follows:

IMPORTANT! We will have two *secondary camps*. The duration of this secondary camp's will also be for three weeks, each week (Wensdays, Thursday and Fridays) community of **Villa Paradiso**, and Community Center in **Villa Valedor** (2:30pm to 06:00pm, The investment time can vary in these two) as an extended work of Crossover CUPS Mission.

What we expect of you?

Organization: the experience to work with foreign missionary teams or groups has led to short lasting impact results in the lives of the participants, all referred to the difficulty of children and youth understanding by the limitations to speak the local language. For all this, it is established that the teachings and impartations will be developed by the CCW local team (resident missionaries Spanish speakers) and the missionary teams will support us and the camp with crafts, additional activities like games, and order with children, cleaning the camp area between classes and snacks.



Tentative schedule and responsible per class: The one and half hour of each class will need to consider,

** It is necessary to anticipate that each team should be ready to share a life testimony, tale or short motivational story to be submitted each class (3 per week) in just a few minutes and this must be different from the testimony to be shared in the seedbed

A special requirement for each team is that we all keep praying and interceding for our children and youth. If we guide them in this training time, we believe they will begin to manifest, express and produce the love of Christ and the kingdom of their lives, their families, their churches, their communities and their country.



“Promises” is a specific space (Sewing Classroom-Zion Village) and time (3:30 - 4:00 pm) for mothers with babies and children less than 5 years of age or mother who accompanying their kids to camp, only for prayer, to keep them informed of the topics daily to their children are taught, to have a little snack or gift. We recommend for this time have the testimony of a lady from the missionary team, so each team should preparer three different short testimonies per week.
